Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council has developed a number of new policies. The strategy has been developed in partnership with the Borough's Age Friendly Alliance, supported by the Council.	
	Vision: People in the Armagh, Banbridge and Craigavon area are valued regardless of age and are supported to age well and with confidence

	The proposed strategy and action plan will have a positive impact on all section 75 categories but in particular the following: People aged 50+ People with a disability Carers Implementation of the action plan should mitigate any issues. The strategy and action plan will be reviewed and revised annually by the Alliance to consider what has worked well and less well over the previous year taking into account new challenges and opportunities. Anticipated timescales for the completion of actions will also be reviewed and revised annually, as necessary. The strategy and action plan will also be included in the review processes for the Borough's Community Planning Strategic Partnership.	
Banbridge Town Dressing Project	The Banbridge Town Dressing Project is part of the Banbridge Benefits Realisation Project which was aimed at supporting the town as it entered into a new era in its development and in particular given the opening of the multi-million fund Game of Thrones Studio Tour. The scheme aims to install 40 no. 6m and 8m Flagpoles. It is believed once installed the flag poles will greatly enhance the gateways and approaches to the town centre, and will allow the council to showcase Banbridge at particular periods in the year through banners. The locations have been specifically selected because of their prominence. As a result of the planning permission process 2 sites were removed from the scheme.	2

	The scheme will benefit all Section 75 groups by enhancing and regenerating the physical environment and improving the general appearance leading to potential future regeneration opportunities. However, while we don't anticipate difficulties, there may be a possibility that other flags could be attached to the flagpoles within the residential areas and as a result this may have a negative impact on equality and good relations within these areas. The following measures will mitigate any potential impact on equality and good relations:	
	 While events are being advertised it is less likely that other flags will be flown Similar flag poles have been erected in Armagh City but to date there have not been any issues. The Council's Emerging Issues Working Group will address any potential difficulties if required. 	
Corporate Health and Safety Policy	The policy will ensure a consistent approach to Health and Safety within the Council and make clear the Council's commitment to the Health and Safety of anyone who may be affected by the Council's acts or omissions. 	the quality of the building stock and respective streetscape within Tandragee, Keady, Richhill, Rathfriland, Dollingstown, Gilford, Donaghcloney, Markethill, Magheralin, Laurelvale/Mullavilly, Aghagallon and Bleary. Property owners wishing to undertake works to enhance the lettability, functionality and appearance of their property will be able to apply for grant assistance through the Scheme to encourage commercial property owners	
	to invest in their buildings and reduce long term vacancy, thereby improving the vitality and vibrancy of our Borough for all users.
