The following Notice of Motion was adopted at the full Council meeting on 23 November 2023.

The Notice of Motion stated:

"That Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council recognises the 70 years of service rendered by the late her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, as the United Kingdom's longest reigning monarch.

In recognition of her shining example of exemplary selfless service, we the undersigned propose that a substantial permanent memorial be commissioned and located within Armagh City and be in situ before or during 2026. We believe that the memorial should depict Queen Elizabeth II during her coronation and that ideally it would be located in a prominent and visible location in Armagh City.

We further propose that officers prepare a report, taking this matter forward, to include options for design, location, consultation with appropriate groups and identification of a suitable budget as part of the estimates process.

The statue will be a fitting tribute by the people of the Borough to the late Monarch"

A bust could be designed and located within the Armagh Palace Chapel. The late Queen Elizabeth II conferred City status on Armagh in 1995. it is felt that this venue would be warmly received as part of an application to the Cabinet Office and any potential unveiling or inauguration.

A bust is thought to cost in the region of  $\pounds 60/80$ k to deliver. Estimated costs for design and commissioning are  $\pounds 20,000$ , with a further estimate of  $\pounds 60,000$  for manufacture and installation.

#### Intended aims/outcomes. What is the policy trying to achieve?

The Notice of Motion states that a permanent memorial would recognise the 70 years of service rendered by the late her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, as the United Kingdom's longest reigning monarch and would also reflect "her shining example of exemplary selfless service".

Other comments recorded at the meeting included:

The quality of her service should also be remembered. Queen Elizabeth II was 'one of a kind' The late Queen Elizabeth II conferred City status on Armagh in 1995. The late Queen and members of the Royal Family have had a long and enduring relationship with Armagh.

#### **Policy Framework**

This proposal has been developed in response to the Notice of Motion to commission a permanent statue of the late her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The Council has discretion to amend the policy.

Yes, however as explained in the CRC/HLF document 'Decade of Anniversaries Tool kit: Understanding Our Past, Shaping Our Future' Commemorations can be a mixed bag. On the one hand they can be an enjoyable experience that opens up historical events in a way that makes a personal impact but on the other hand they can be difficult and divisive. A permanent memorial of the late Queen Elizabeth 11 is more likely to be welcomed by the Protestant/Unionist Community but is less likely to be celebrated by the Catholic/Nationalist Community

	A survey carried out on the proposed locations for the N.I centenary stones in January 2024 showed that while the majority of respondents welcomed the placement of the stones strong comments were received from the respondents who disagreed with the placement of the stones.
	Positive Comments included a significant milestone that should be commemorated. Many were happy to see the placement of centenary stones in towns that they either live or work in or regularly visit.
	Negative comments included that it was not a good use of public money and they had the potential to be divisive.
	In relation to the location of the stones it was suggested that they are placed in an area that is acceptable to the majority of people. Another comment suggested that they may be at risk of vandalism. Others made specific suggestions about where in the town they should be located.
	In December 2023 the three main Civic Buildings were lit up white and blue for a seven-day period, as an expression of support and sign of solidarity with Israel following the Hamas terror attacks on Saturday 7 October. Following this decision Pro Palestine Protestors gathered at the Civic Centre in Craigavon and the Palace Building in Armagh.
