Council have appointed a consultant to develop a new five year Aquatic Framework for the Borough for 2019-2024, which will focus on working together with key stakeholders to develop the whole area of aquatics.

Intended aims/outcomes. What is the policy trying to achieve?

The aim is to produce a 5 year Aquatic Framework and Action Plan which identifies the following priorities:

- Harmonisation across all Council facilities
- Swim tuition programmes and tuition activities
- Participant pathways, club links & talent development
- Targeting specific groups (women and girls, people with a disability, areas of high social need etc.) and identify the barriers to their participation
- Workforce development (paid and voluntary)
- Recreational activities
- Club development plan(s) for resident swimming clubs (if desired)
- Development of South Lakes Leisure Centre to include both indoor and outdoor water space and activities
- Development of the Armagh Leisure Project
- Viability and sustainability of the strategy
