#### 1. Welcome and Introductions

John Mc Guinness, ABC Community Network welcomed the panel to the meeting as the Chair of Community and Voluntary Sector Panel. John welcomed Anna Clarke from Prospect Awards CIC who would be facilitating the session.

John advised that since the last meeting of the Panel in November that a small planning group had been established made up of the chairs of the panel and the representatives who sit on the Strategic Partnership. Members of the planning group are: John McGuinness, Geraldine Lawless, Gilbert Lee, Brendan McCann and Sheila McCreesh. This planning group had met a few times and the following discussions had taken place: Panel planning group members have the following concerns:

- lack of coordination and communication between panel members sitting on TAP Teams and with wider panel
- some panel members feel that they are unable to influence action planning process
- unsure how many panel members are actively participating in TAP Teams and whether they are clear about whether they are part of particular TAP Teams
- Panel development programme covered as part of agenda item 5

John went through the notes of the previous meeting and requested an update on the following actions from the community planning team.

Jennie advised the themes identified at the previous session will make up part of the panel development programme and will include a good practice visit. This will be an overnight visit

to Monaghan County Council to meet with their Public Participation Network, which is the community planning equivalent to our panel. An expression of interest will be sent to all panel members.

• Volunteer mileage – council have approved travel expenses for panel members who are not able to claim this back through their own organisation or another source. The agreed rate is 0.45p at the current HMRC mileage rate. The documentation will be sent to all panel members in the next week or two. Panel members who have been involved in meetings from January will be able to back date their claim.

#### Actions: CPT to circulate expression of interest for Study Visit to Monaghan CPT to circulate mileage documentation.

Anna led a round of speed networking to allow panel members to make personal introductions.

# 3. Community Planning update

Jennie Dunlop, Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council provided a community planning update elaborating briefly on the following points:

- ✓ Community Plan published
- ✓ Community Planning Partnership established
- ✓ Six Collaborative Action Plans developed

Enhanced and Revitalised Action Plan was taken before the CPSP for consideration earlier this month on 20th March. This was final action plan for the community plan to be developed. There are 60 collaborative actions across each of the six action plans with 10% of these being led by the Community and Voluntary Sector. Jennie remarked that the CPSP had praised the input from the sector throughout action planning process.

#### ✓ Communications Plan agreed

The communications plan for the CPP has been agreed. CPT are mindful that communications is an area in which more work is required for the partnership and that as the communications plan embeds communications will improve. To help improve the flow of the information the community planning team are considering producing a newsletter for the partnership.

The next big things on the partnerships agenda for the coming year are:

Community Engagement Strategy

Community planning partnership is being supported by the Carnegie UKT Trust

- Leadership Programme
- Implementation of Action Plans
- First Progress Report due November 2019

Brendan Curran pointed out that during the action planning process for the Enhanced and Revitalised Place that it was reassuring to see that the community in the room were being listened to and this was evident in the final action plan. Jennie advised that now the action plans were produced panel members still had an opportunity to shape the projects that will come out of them.

Action: CPT will organise workshop with panel members involved in TAP to find a mechanism for better sharing across the panel.

#### 4. Member update

Anna invited some panel members to share a good news story about their group or community.

Keith McCann – Regenerate, spoke of the youth project in Kilicomaine that Regenerate was involved in where youth reimagined a disused bus shelter and have now expressed a strong interest in community development work.

Gilbert Lee- Banbridge Twinning Association – had recently taken part in a study visit to Wales with other members of the Community Planning Strategic Partnership as part of the Carnegie UK Trust "Embedding Wellbeing in Northern Ireland project. He shared the Welsh approach and how a library was now being used as a Community Hub and in another town the council have taken over a post office franchise and were planning to run it through a library.

Chris Leech, Craigavon Foodbank – shared a story of local youth worker who had undertaken to walk the Black path at 5am every day in March and had raised £5000 to date.

# 5 & 6 Round Table Planning

Anna recapped on the themes identified by panel members at the last meeting.

Theme one: Mental Health and Well-being Theme two: Employability Theme three: Communities – current context and development opportunities.

Anna facilitated a round table exercise where panel members in their groups planned an event based on their chosen theme. The next meeting would take a mental health and wellbeing focus. Panel members will be invited to participate in a working group session to organise each of the events.
