South Lake Leisure Centre construction progress

Construction of the new facility is advancing swiftly and the focus is now on the internal works including:

- Installation of pool equipment
- Screeding works (laying of floors)
- Installation of HV cables
- Tiling of 50m pool (due to be completed in December 2019)
- Installation of main services: sub-station, gas mains and telephone services

Wet side progress

You'll be updated periodically as construction progresses, and Leisure Matters will focus on one particular area in each edition within the building to give you a feel for each aspect. This issue will focus on the wet side, including the 50m pool, teaching/training pool and the leisure water.



Recent image of Leisure Water area

Teaching / Training pool:

- 13m x 7m
- Depth constant at 1.2m
- The viewing area will seat 20 people with space poolside for 18 people

Leisure water:

- Pool depth 0-400mm
- Suitable for children 0-8 years old

Pool changing area:

- Five family/team changing rooms
- Changing capacity of 119
- Underfloor heating installed

- The main swimming pool is 50m long x 21m wide
- There are two booms, one that traverses from the right hand side to the left and the other rises from the pool deck
- The traversing boom effectively forms the right hand side pool wall so when it moves to the left there is no reduction to the 50m pool length
- When the rising boom is deployed, it reduces pool length by the width of the boom (circa 600mm/800mm)
- Maximum water depth is 2.0m
- Staff can stand on the booms
- An electronic timing system is being installed for competitions
- A first aid room and timing room is on poolside
- A changing places room is on poolside with access to the pool deck
- A pool pod will be available for our less able customers to access the water
- Tiered seating for 280 people
