Staff Engagement

As you are aware that despite the disruption, the 'Leisure Transformation Project Team' continue to plan for the opening of SLLC, and to move forward with the Transformation Programme as far as is practicable.

The team have committed to communicate with our indoor leisure staff as effectively and as regularly as we can.

In this update, we will focus on a number of issues: Covid-19, on-line training update, HR update, 'Leisure Transformation Project Team' update and staff questions/queries.



Covid 19

Our organisation is once again facing a challenging time, due to the heightened restrictions being introduced by the Northern Ireland Executive from the 16.10.20.

As part of these new restrictions it was announced yesterday that our Arts and Culture facilities will now close, along with several elements of our indoor leisure services. For those staff affected by these changes it is important to know that your line managers will be in contact with you directly to discuss an action plan for the next four weeks.

This is an evolving situation which will take a concerted effort from us all, once again, to navigate through, whilst keeping safe. The rapid increase in transmission of Covid-19 across Northern Ireland is very concerning, and it is up to us individually, to abide by the regulations to protect each other and our families.

The Wearing of Face Masks

It is the largest and most complex statistical exercise undertaken in Northern Ireland and provides a benchmark on the size of our population.

The award-winning parks include Gosford Forest Park, Palace Demesne Public Park, Canal Greenway, Solitude Park, Loughbrickland Park, Lurgan Park, Portadown People's Park, Brownstown Park, Edenvilla Park and Tannaghmore Gardens.

Undergoing a rigorous and robust assessment process led by a volunteer panel of experts, the parks had to demonstrate that they met a range of strict criteria including horticultural standards, cleanliness, environmental management, biodiversity, community involvement and safety standards to achieve the distinguished accreditation.

Keep Northern Ireland Beautiful (KNIB), the environmental charity who operates the Green Flag Award Scheme in Northern Ireland, has witnessed a surge in successful participating locations since the initial three awarded sites in 2008 - with a record number of 78 locations across Northern Ireland recognised this year.

Update from the 'Leisure Transformation Project Team'

The 'Leisure Transformation Project Team' would like to give information regarding some of the projects that we have been working in relation to indoor leisure across the Borough;

IncredABLE @ South Lake

Council has awarded the contract for hospitality services at South Lake Leisure Centre to leading local social enterprise IncredABLE.

IncredABLE will operate the new café and a suite of hospitality services at the new Centre, as excitement builds with only two weeks to opening.

The new Café incredABLE will occupy a prominent position on the ground floor within the expansive, multi-access reception area and will be an integral part of the new multi-million-pound complex. The new café will operate daily from 8am until 8pm and will offer a full all-day menu including refreshments, snacks and hot and cold food. However, under current public health guidance, only takeaway food and drink will be available for a temporary period.





Covid restriction implications for indoor leisure

As you are all aware the NI Executive announced additional restrictions due to an increase in Coronavirus (COVID-19).

These new restrictions are being put in place to help reduce the spread of coronavirus and to help manage the pressures on our health and social care system.

The restrictions were introduced on the 16 October 2020 and will be in place for four weeks.

Everyone has their part to play to stopping the spread of the virus in the community by limiting your contact with others; regular handwashing, wearing of <u>face coverings</u> and good social distancing.

A number of staff where sent home this week from SLLC and OLC following a member of staff testing positive for Covid-19. In August 2020, Council's HR recovery Task Group developed a 'COVID-19: Confirmed case or symptomatic individual protocol.'

This guidance provides a protocol to deal with a confirmed case/s or symptomatic individuals including employees and the public, all indoor leisure staff are asked to read this protocol to make themselves aware of the procedure: http://abc-svr-intra.abc.local/wp-content/uploads/2020/09/CoVid-19-Confirmed-case-or-symptomatic-individual-protocol-V2.3-no-contacts.pdf

This week the Chief Executive issued a memo requesting staff to wear face masks; therefore, Indoor leisure staff are specifically requested to;

Wear face masks in <u>all</u> indoor areas of leisure centres <u>except</u>:

- 1. On poolside (Need for emergency communication/temperature of environment/easy to social distance on poolside).
- 2. In plant areas (These are staff only areas with minimal people).
- 3. In staff rooms (Need to eat and drink).
- 4. In Office areas (Need to communicate on the phone frequently).
- 5. In Reception areas (Need to communicate on the phone frequently, protective screens are in place)

However, if staff wish to wear a face mask in these areas and can conduct their duties safely, this is perfectly acceptable.

Council's Corporate Manager (Safety and resilience) is seeking clarification regarding if member of the public should be asked to wear face masks whilst in Council buildings; once this information is received it will be communicated to members of staff and the public.
