<u>Covid</u>

£640k Investment at Kinnego Marina Gets Underway

Kinnego Marina is set to see an investment of over £640,000 for a new state-of-the-art Lough Neagh Rescue Centre and high-spec glamping pods.

Led by 'Southern Organisation for Action in Rural areas' or more commonly known as SOAR ABC, the highly anticipated project received an investment of over £480,000 from the NI Rural Development Programme with additional funds coming from ABC Council's Financial Assistance Programme and the Ulster Community Investment Fund.



This exciting scheme will deliver a modern, fit-for-purpose rescue centre for the Lough Neagh Rescue team and four new glamping pods as well as aesthetic enhancements to the area, helping the popular recreational and visitor destination reach its full potential.

Starting last week, the project will see the construction of a brand new Lough Neagh Rescue Centre, establishing it as the central base for rescue, training and cooperation activity, as well as the development of four new high-spec glamping pods, providing an added boost to the local tourism offering and economy. The revamp, due to complete in early 2021, will also include new fencing, road resurfacing, a utility block refit and an upgrade to the rescue centre's 'Gary Breen' vessel.

The regeneration works at Kinnego Marina represent one element of a wider collaboration initiative between SOAR ABC and neighbouring local action groups: Mid Ulster Rural Development Programme and GROW South Antrim. Working together under the Lough Neagh Cooperation Project and funded through the All Island LEADER Cooperation Scheme, the joint venture is committed to delivering larger and more integrated improvement schemes across the Lough Shore enhancing its accessibility and utility.



Update from the 'Leisure Transformation Project Team'

The 'Leisure Transformation Project Team' would like to give information regarding some of the projects that we have been working in relation to indoor leisure across the Borough;

<u>Transformation of the Wider Indoor Leisure Centres – Update 9th December 2020</u>

As you are aware it was the intention to continue on the journey with the transformation of Indoor Leisure; however, this was unfortunately delayed by Covid-19.

It is now great to report that the transformation process has re-commenced at the following eight indoor facilities;

- Banbridge Leisure Centre
- Dromore Community Centre
- Gilford Community Centre
- Keady Recreation Centre
- Rathfriland Community Centre
- Richhill Recreation Centre
- Tandragee Recreation Centre
- Orchard Leisure Centre

Completion of transformation across Indoor Leisure and a re-structure of staffing at the listed sites is necessary to achieve a consistency of resources and approach, for the following reasons:

- Indoor Leisure, as a whole, share;
 - The same objectives and targets to be an industry leader, and deliver an improved leisure service.
 - The same ABC wide customer membership/charging system.
 - The same need to demonstrate that the "In House Model" can transform and perform.



- Good employee relations fairness and consistency are necessary in this regard and currently staff have different job descriptions and pay grades for the same roles in many cases.
- Management and staff resources are currently inconsistent from site to site.
- Job roles (new and existing) need to align with South Lake LC and with best industry practice.
- Banbridge LC and Orchard LC, as wet/large centres, need to change to early morning (6am) opening (Monday to Friday) to align with best industry practice and South Lake LC as soon as possible in 2021.
- The need to improve staff flexibility and sharing across all sites.

Consultation

The Indoor Leisure Manager (Stephen Tully), is working in partnership with trade union representatives (Catherine McNeill - NIPSA, Ronald Conn - UNITE, and Kieran McParland - GMB) and Caroline Brennan - HR Officer, are currently engaging directly with staff, by visiting each site in a face-to-face consultation process (these meetings are being managed and operated in line with current PHA guidance and protocols).

This consultation/engagement process mirrors the methodology and partnership approach adopted at South Lake Leisure Centre.

The details of the consultation are;

- A two-week informal staff consultation on new job descriptions to gather staff feedback/input for consideration commenced.
- Formal consultation with trade unions on new Job Descriptions should be completed in early Jan 2021.

- Evaluation of new job descriptions should be completed in Jan 2021.
- Consultation on new staff rotas, where necessary commenced.

- Recruitment for new job roles should commence in Jan 2021.
- Individual consultation on a small number of necessary staff re-deployments commenced.
- Sales and marketing training for management and front line staff planned for Feb 2021.
- Other transformation training has been delivered already along with South Lake staff and other training is planned.
- Weekly update on the Leisure Matters intranet page, which staff can access from any device.

NI Executive restrictions

As you are all aware the NI Executive announced a new round of restrictions which came in to play on Friday 27th November with a finish date of the 11th December. These restrictions meant that we had to close all of our facilities during this timeframe (apart from those providing child care services).

Given that we were unable to provide a service to our customers the decision was made that all existing members would not have to pay their direct debit fees for the month of December; therefore, when we open our service from the 11th December all existing members will be using our service free of charge as recompense for the disruption they have had to endure over the last number of months.

It was also agreed that if a new customer took out a membership during the month of December that they too would be able to avail of the service free of charge until the end of the month.

This was advertised through social media.



South Lake Leisure Centre Vaccination Programme

The Department of Health has confirmed that South Lake Leisure Centre's Sports Hall will be used as the Southern Trusts Vaccination Programme Centre.

In total seven sites across Northern Ireland will be used to distribute the vaccine. The others include the Royal Victoria Hospital in Belfast, the Ulster Hospital (South Eastern Trust), Seven Towers Leisure Centre in Ballymena (Northern Trust), and the Foyle Arena in Londonderry, Omagh Leisure Centre and Lakeside Leisure Centre in Enniskillen (South Eastern Trust).

At the moment decisions are being finalised by the Department regarding how this facility will be used to provide this vaccination service, but it is anticipated that the roll out will commence early next week.
